Building on the strategic vision ICESCO Roads for the Future and its supporting initiatives - such as the ICESCO International Network - Creative ICESCO, ICESCO International Chairs Network for Thought, Literature, and Arts, ICESCO Agora (an international think tank promoting "Culture for Rethinking the World"), ICESCO Center for Holistic Policies for the Promotion of Cultural Reality (ICESCO Think Tank for International Relations and Cultural Diplomacy), and ICESCO's Islamic World Heritage Center—the Organization's work and its strategic cultural and heritage objectives are determined through developing both theoretical and applied research frameworks, and leveraging a multi-faceted platform system and portals open to leading intellectual figures, researchers, scholars, and creators from across the globe, from the East, West, Asia, and Africa.

ICESCO aims to make culture, heritage, and cultural sciences, including intellectual, literary, and artistic creativity, a knowledge base and a methodological starting point for understanding current political, educational, social, economic, and digital phenomena, in order to value and advance these fields. ICESCO places its bet on cultural and heritage knowledge as essential drivers of human and humanitarian development, drawing on meanings, symbols, and diverse human imagination within a renewed global context. The accelerating transformations in digitalization and the knowledge economy across societies further underscore this approach.

ICESCO's strategic focus includes the following:

- Exploring the manifestations of creativity, humanities, and cultural policies for development.
- Analyzing the nature of heritage and evolving culture as starting points for intellectual and conceptual debate.
- · Studying the digital cultural economy, contemporary arts, literary and poetic creation, visual arts, creative contexts, and the valorization of cultural and natural heritage.
- · Promoting creative education, cultural scientific research, and the regulation of policies in the performance and events sector.
- · Developing visual arts, crafts, the book and publishing sector, and the press, as well as structuring the audiovisual field and interactive communication tools.
- Strengthening the design sector, creative services, and the preservation and valorization of tangible and intangible heritage through heritage registration, digitization, and capacity building.
- Examining approaches to integrated cultural policies, both theoretical and applied, related to production drivers and operational resources, while opening up to non-traditional fields such as revenues from audiovisual productions, visual arts, architecture, publishing, live performances, performing arts, entertainment, and heritage.

In addition to studying new developmental cultural models in relation to horizontal sectoral policies that place confidence on artificial intelligence, creative supports for smartphones and applied software, the cultural economy today generates revenues seven times greater than those of the automotive, agricultural, and manufacturing industries. This underscores the value of the integrated digital cultural economic and industrial model, which has become a global production engine leveraged by developed nations to enhance its contribution to GDP and to develop productive capacities for a sector that now generates approximately \$2.25 trillion globally, accounting for 3% of the world's GDP, and employs 29.5 million individuals, representing about 1% of the active workforce.







Overview:

- ICESCO International Think Tank for Thought, Letters and Arts, under the theme, "Culture for Rethinking the World," with participation of number ministers, intellectuals, university presidents, professors and specialists in the fields of culture and arts.
- "Culture for rethinking the world" and developing a comprehensive approach that directly connects the elements of culture and heritage with the advances in the digital, educational, scientific, research and creative intelligence fields by defining a new vision based on translating the principle of the right to culture into a general and comprehensive daily reality. This approach can also be established through building a citizen-based culture, democratizing the participatory cultural rights, and consolidating cultural decentralization and local governance of cultural affairs to turn culture into an effective element for development and employment in a direct and indirect way.



Results and Outcomes::

- More than 120 articles published in arts, literature, heritage and archaeology, and so far, 79 researchers are part of the group.
- The articles published generate visibility for ICESCO through the chain of researchers involved, there are articles with more than 700 views and shares and the average is around 200 views.







It offers access to ICESCO's latest visual projects, promotes cultural entrepreneurship, assists with funding brilliant projects, and opens a discussion space that gathers diverse communities all over the world.
- The Platform brings together all of ICESCO's digital projects and also expands access to a variety of cultural works and products.
- The online space is divided into six main interactive paths and content collections: ICESCO Agora, ICESCO Center for Holistic Policies, The Capitals of Culture, Digital Media and Youth Elite.
- The aim is for these spaces to be able to connect more with young people and new generations, increasingly raising cultural, cultural and civilizational awareness among the nations of ICESCO Member States, but also from ICESCO to the world.



Results and Outcomes:

- ICESCO Agora counts more than 120 articles that have been published in different fields such as the arts, literature, heritage and archaeology, and so far, 79 researchers are part of the group. The articles published generate visibility for ICESCO through the chain of researchers involved, there are articles with more than 700 views and shares and the average is around 200 views.
- ICESCO Center for Holistic Policies, brings together 10 Chairs, more than 40 articles and more than 12 publications. This is the space for ICESCO Think Tank for International Relations & Cultural Diplomacy, and brings together all the studies, documents and projects of ICESCO with its academic partners for the development and guidance of cultural policies. Everything that concerns the encouragement, development and discussion of the right to culture and the indicators that show the institutional situation of culture in each country.
- ICESCO's Programme for Culture Capitals in the Islamic World is the space to highlight all the activities of, by far, one of the Organization's most successful civilizational programmes. It considerably contributes, locally, nationally, regionally and internationally, to exhibiting the richness and diversity of the celebrated capitals' culture, and to publicizing their historical

monuments and cultural institutions; distinguished scholars, thinkers, writers, artists and creators; and their natural, tangible and intangible cultural and artistic heritage. This section of the virtual center, gathers the information on the current capitals and also serves as an archive for all the activities held on the former capitals since 2019. Overall, there were more than 500 events, more than 55 cities nominated and they always represent three different regions of the Islamic world.

 ICESCO Digital Media: In this sector of the platform, there are three spaces for interaction: the Cinema Center, Image Center, Theater House and the Digital Library.

Cinema Center: This part of the site focuses on cinematic work and creations, providing a digital showcase for arts publications and hosting various cinematic projects. It aims to promote culture as a factor of social and human development.

Image Center: This section likely includes photo exhibitions and other visual arts projects, promoting the art of photography and other related media. The center already has more than 15 registered artists presenting virtual exhibitions.

Theatre House: Dedicated to performing arts, this platform is open to a worldwide audience and showcases various forms of theatre and opera, there are more than 20 videos of performances available on the platform.

Digital Library: This offers a repository of digital publications and information, likely accessible to users for educational and cultural purposes, up to now there are approximately 10 books already available.

Activities of ICESCO Chair for **Thinking about Living Together - Tunisia**

Day by day, in its latest writings regarding the establishment of academic chairs in culture, arts, and humanities around the world, ICESCO demonstrates that this chair is, above all, a hub of excellence for active thought, focused on public affairs, approached scientifically and brought closer to the understanding of the general public. Its mission is to serve peace, tolerance, and coexistence, which are fundamental values in Islam and Islamic thought. It is also a space for networking between different intellectuals, thinkers, researchers, and those interested in intellectual matters in general, and Islamic thought in particular, as well as students from around the world to share knowledge and arts. Objective:

Coexistence:

By living together, we mean the ability of humans to transform their natural sociability into a rational and conscious sociability. Living together, achieved within the framework of conscious sociability, is a form of coexistence organized according to rules of rights and duties and based on values of companionship, love, peace, and hospitality. All of this is embodied in the concept of Ta'anus, which initially signifies a kind of living together within harmony and unity, expressing not only justice accompanied by wisdom and love but also possible harmony between individuals. It represents a humanity founded on difference, respect, and love.

The term coexistence must be understood in its meaning contained in the Arabic word "Ta'anus," which combines human sociability with wisdom, the joy of meeting, enriching difference, friendship, affection, and, finally, hospitality and openness to the other.

Meddeb Foundation for the ICESCO Chair of Oriental Cultures

1. Aspirations:

- The Foundation has set itself the mission of continuing the work of Abdelwahab Meddeb, who, through various means, always worked towards fostering understanding between different worlds to achieve a peaceful relationship between Islam and the West. The Foundation aims to promote scientific research on Islam within civil society as well as research communities: "a duty of memory towards what Islam has contributed."
- It also offers editorial work, translations of literary works from French to Arabic, and translation workshops. It hosts scientific seminars, lectures by intellectuals, translators, and artists, and international meetings.

2. Orientations

Interdisciplinary Doctoral Seminars on Islam as a Religious, Social, and Historical Phenomenon:

a. Images and Representations: Imagery in Islam – History and Historical Use

Researchers have worked on imagery in Islam, focusing on the impact of a tense context on the subject of study:

In the pre-modern Islamic world, images were more present than generally believed, and figurative representation was far from nonexistent. The seminar, centered on the medieval period, but not excluding forays into modern and contemporary periods, will offer thematic sessions examining the presence of images, their production contexts, as well as the varied uses they had in Islamic societies.

b. The Clash of Universalisms in the Postcolonial Context

A comparative study of the work of three authors: Édouard Glissant, Robert Jaulin, and Abdelwahab Meddeb, based on their contributions to the journal Dédale.

Context:

The purpose of this Meeting, which will take place in October 2024 at the Maison de l'Amérique Latine in Paris (in collaboration with the Institut du Tout-monde and Université Paris 7), is to reinvent a universalism imposed by the West that has made the contributions of other civilizational spaces forgotten or rejected.

This discussion connects to a broader question raised by Alain de Libéra, the need to pluralize the field of history. Édouard Glissant advocates for an ethnology of relationship: "The writer is the ethnologist of himself, integrating into the uniqueness of his work the entire diversity of the world..."

Facing a universalism of conformity that reduces the other to oneself, Robert Jaulin defended a universalism of encounter and compatibility.

Abdelwahab Meddeb, neither in full adherence nor in rupture, engages both the Islamic/Arab legacy and European culture. From his back-and-forth between East and West—which shaped him—emerged a thought that draws from all those historical moments where the two entities intermingled in a process of mutual inclusion. One of his bedside books was Goethe's Westöstlicher Divan.

Art, Nature and Hybrid Processes

Program and Achievements:

- The Art, Nature and Hybrid Processes Chair has a central objective of promoting and contributing to the dissemination of research-creations that involve the relationship between nature and culture, with a focus on contemporary art. Its mission is to promote values related to the perception of the natural world, resulting from a fusion of sensitivities regarding the relationship between humans and the environment from various perspectives. In a world where technology increasingly shapes lifestyles and social behavior, the Chair encourages original creations and methods that foster alternative ways of relating to nature in its modes of existence, action, and production.
- To achieve its goals, the Chair undertakes various initiatives and actions, among which the Artist Residencies at the Yves Maraey Institute stand out. This project aims to offer artists a space for immersion and creation, stimulating outdoor experiences and promoting productions and reflections in dialogue with the environment. The purpose is to explore new forms of expression and environmental awareness. The project also provides the opportunity for artists to participate in an environment of idea exchange with art critic Maria Amélia Bulhões and to share experiences and skills with sculptor Irineu Garcia. These mentors welcome and encourage resident artists, creating opportunities for different perspectives and perceptions of the environment to be shared and integrated.
- The Residency program was inaugurated by guest artists Gisele Riker and Mariana Wartchow, both of whom are developing research projects within the Postgraduate Program in Visual Arts at UFRGS. Gisele is a PhD student in the interinstitutional doctoral program with the Federal University of Amazonas. Her project is rooted in a sensitive approach to the trees of the Amazon rainforest, drawing on the ideas of Emanuele Coccia. Mariana is developing a project as part of her master's degree in visual poetics. Her project addresses issues of nature in a direct relationship with the body and material, involving ceramic processes and a contemplative daily practice mediated by meditation.
- Through the artist residency projects of Mariana Wartchow and Gisele Riker at the Yves Maraey Institute, the Art and Nature, Hybrid Processes Chair encourages interdisciplinary and cultural collaboration, as well as exchanges of experiences and perspectives related to art. The Chair contributes to deepening environmental awareness in an integrated and dynamic way through the work of the artists.



Report by Maria Amélia Bulhões

During the residency, which took place from April 6 to 20, 2024, artists Gisele Ricker and Mariana Wartchow developed their projects and participated in numerous activities over 15 days. They were accompanied by the president of the Institute, artist Irineu Garcia, and myself, as an art critic. At the beginning, the artists presented their work projects, to which I was able to provide some initial suggestions.

The first activities involved exploratory walks around the Institute's grounds, familiarizing themselves with the space to assess the feasibility of their projects, which had been presented before the residency began. Irineu Garcia's guidance was crucial in directing the artists' choices during this phase. Later, the artists began their work, each freely pursuing their own experiments. Over time, many exchanges took place, especially during meals and in the evenings, as during other times, each artist was fully immersed in her personal work. As an art critic, I followed their progress closely, observing and making notes for later discussions.

At the end of the first week, we held the first discussion meeting, where the artists presented how they had aligned their initial proposals with the ongoing work in the Institute's space. Many adjustments and new discoveries were noted, which I sought to guide by offering theoretical and conceptual comments, suggesting readings, and recommending artworks by other artists that could help consolidate their work. The exchange between the artists was also important at this point, particularly in terms of incorporating each other's specific knowledge into the other's work. This rich and generous spirit of collaboration greatly enhanced the outcomes for both.

During the second week, exchanges intensified, with every stage of work being followed by all participants, creating a genuine collective effort in many tasks. The atmosphere of camaraderie was one of the most noteworthy aspects of this residency, which had a highly experimental and dynamic character.

We organized a live session on Instagram with all project participants, where the artists shared their ideas and the work they had developed with the public, and exchanged impressions about their experience in the residency with Irineu Garcia, Maria Amélia, and Sandra Rev.

In conclusion, we held an evaluation meeting with the participants, where we noted the significant qualitative improvements in the projects resulting from the interactions that took place. My suggestions were explored with interest and depth, which was very gratifying. I consider the results of this residency to be highly positive, as will be reflected in the electronic catalogs currently being prepared by the artists.

Artist Residency at the National School of Architecture in Marrakech

Facilitator: Sandra Rey

At the invitation of the Director of the Department of Culture and Communication at ICESCO and ICESCO Creative, the Director of the Art and Nature, and Hybrid Processes Chair, Sandra Rey, conducted an artist residency at the Higher School of Architecture in Marrakech. She developed a workshop centered on exploring the environment and landscape, based on the artist's research-creation. To raise students' awareness of the environment, an aesthetic experience was proposed through walking, with the aim of connecting with nature and photographing the surroundings.

The program began with the artist's introduction, followed by an introductory lecture on the historical importance of walking in 20th-century art movements, focusing on the Dada group, Surrealists, Land Art, Minimal Art, and the Situationist International. The approach to contemporary art was particularly anchored in the artist's own practice.

Workshops in nature were held in the El Harti and Aarst Molay Abdeslam gardens, promoting reflection on landscape and environmental issues, as well as practicing walking and taking photographs of the surroundings. The students then processed these photos through digital editing in workshop sessions led by the artist.

The new images produced by the students were compiled into a video and presented on the facades of the Dar El Bacha Confluence Museum during the opening ceremony of ICESCO Week in Marrakech, the 2024 Cultural Capital.

The students actively participated in all stages of the workshop, including choosing the spaces at the museum where the images they created during the workshop were projected. The entire program was designed as an extension of the ICESCO Creative platform, immersing students in an artistic experience that meaningfully connected them to their environment, while providing them with the conceptual and technical skills to express their unique vision through photography and projection.

The Initiative built a bridge between the National School of Architecture of Marrakech and the ICESCO Chair for Contemporary Art "Art and Nature, Hybrid Processes," based in Porto Alegre, Brazil, fostering intercultural dialogue through meaningful exchanges between the artist's experience, the students, and the public. The video projections and contemporary images displayed on the facades of the magnificent architectural monument of the Dar El Bacha Museum highlighted different times and unexpected visions, promoting an experience of cultural and artistic diversity.

- The proposal of the themes discussed was to approach the question of the links between technology and the environment from the point of view of the body. This question is at the crossroads of several themes presented in the researcher's work. The medical issue, the issue of technical infrastructures, the issue of professionalization, and the issue of distance and experience. The various papers emphasize the link between the experimental sciences and the social sciences.



Results and Outcomes:

We received a large audience of scholars at the EUROMED University in Fez, with around 100 students benefiting from the presentations. We were also able to forge a closer partnership with the Paris 1 Panteon Sorbonne research group and discuss the creation of a working group to further studies for the mutual benefit of those involved.



These indicators aim to assist Member States in building their public cultural policies. The studies are being finalized in three languages: Arabic, French, and English.

ICESCO INDEX: For the promotion of cultural indicators in the Islamic world:

In an increasingly interconnected and digital world, cultural and creative technologies play a crucial role in the socio-economic development of nations.
 Aware of this reality, the Islamic World Educational, Scientific, and Cultural Organization (ICESCO) launched the ICESCO Index for Cultural and Creative Technologies. This innovative index aims to measure and compare the performance of Islamic countries in this strategic field, while identifying progress levers and best practices.

• Cultural GDP in the Islamic World: Methods, Statics, Trends and Recommendations:

- This report presents the cultural indicators most widely used by national and international organizations. A second section is devoted to the objectives of adopting a strategy for the regular production of cultural indicators. A third section analyzes the cultural areas covered by the indicators. The methods and sources widely adopted for the production of statistics relating to cultural indicators are detailed in the fourth section. The report concludes with major trends in the field of cultural indicators.



- ICESCO Proposal to the UN Adding an 18th Goal to the Sustainable Development Goals to Address Various Cultural Needs:
- This report submitted to the United Nations by the Islamic World Educational, Scientific, and Cultural Organization (ICESCO) includes a proposal to add an 18th goal to the global Sustainable Development Goals, dedicated specifically to culture.



- Major Trends of Emerging Technologies and Their Impact on Cultural and Creative Industries (CCI) by 2030
- The cultural sector is constantly evolving due to the influence of technological transformations on how cultural heritage is created, produced, promoted, and consumed. These transformations have various implications for the diversity of cultural expressions, access to culture, and the sustainability of the sector.






• ICESCO Index for Cultural and Creative Technologies

- The main objective of the Index is to provide decision-makers, professionals, and researchers with a comprehensive and up-to-date dashboard on the status and dynamics of cultural and creative technologies in ICESCO Member States. It aims to catalyze the exchange of experiences and partnerships, encourage targeted investments, and stimulate creative entrepreneurship and the employability of young talents.



• ICESCO ImmersivArt (IIA)

- It is an innovative three-phase program/study dedicated to immersive technologies. It begins with an online training covering AR, VR, XR, 360° video, and 3D audio. The second phase provides examples and resources via an online platform. The program culminates in an international festival-competition showcasing the best creations in various categories and offering networking opportunities with experts in the field.



• Promoting Cultural Indicators in ICESCO Member States

- This indicator aims to assess the extent to which individuals have the opportunity to participate in and benefit from cultural services and facilities. Cultural facilities refer to libraries, cinemas, theaters, cultural and artistic education centers and digital cultural resources.
- The objective is to measure the geographical proximity and physical accessibility of these facilities for the population. This indicator also provides information on the availability and diversity of cultural events, such as the frequency of these events and their accessibility in terms of cost and availability of tickets. It also covers the assessment of inclusion policies for all segments of the population, including marginalized groups, the disabled, the elderly, etc.

On the whole, the Project was welcomed by the Sector team, insofar as it was in line with the department's missions. They commented on the importance of the project's anthropological dimension, its impact on the sedentarization of communities, the development of local products and the promotion of heritage know-how, and its contribution to the inclusion of cultural elements on the list of heritage of the Islamic world. The exchanges helped to better define the project's vision and, above all, to make concrete proposals that take into account ICESCO's concerns.
- In short, the discussions led to the need to reinvigorate this cooperation through the implementation of this project on endogenous knowledge, which will take into account ICESCO's observations on both the title and the different variations of the project.
